	Religions have different buildings and the features of some of these buildings. Religious ceremonies are carried out in religious buildings such as weddings and funerals.	Ancient Civilisations had developed a more consistent religious organisation. Ancient Romans worshipped numerous gods and goddesses. Ancient Egyptians worshipped numerous gods and goddesses and they believed in the afterlife.	St John of Beverley was the Saint of the deaf and dumb and he established a settlement on what is now the site of Beverley Minster. After the death of St John, 721 people made a pilgrimage to Beverley. King Athelstan granted Beverley as a place of sanctuary. The attack on the Holy Island of Lindisfarne by the Vikings impacted on the Saxons and their religious convictions. William Wilberforce was motivated to end slavery due to his religious beliefs. Muslims believed that God wanted them to bring Islam to more people and this led to the expansion of the Islamic states.
