Know that the achievements of Ancient Rome are still obvious for people to see around us, including architecture, hygiene and roads. Know that the legacy of the Romans can still be seen across the empire in the remains of monuments such as baths, roads and walls.. Know that the Ancient Egyptians helped us learn a lot about farming, maths and medicine. Know that the Ancient Egyptians left construction techniques that supported the building of monumental pyramids, obelisks and temples.	Know that the Ancient Greeks made important contributions to astronomy, mathematics, medicine and philosophy. Know that the Ancient Greeks were known for their sophisticated architecture and sculpture. Know that the Anglo Saxon period brought about a unified kingdom. Know that it took William Wilberforce 26 years to end the slave trade. Know that the Vikings left a lasting legacy through their exploration. They advanced ship building and established new trade routes across the world. Know that developments in the Early Islamic civilisations outstripped those of anywhere else in the world. There was free education, free health care, litter collection, paved streets (lit at night), public baths and sewage systems.
