Use a variety of conjugations of 'être' and 'avoir' to ask and answer a series of questions. Be able to make comparisons using adjectives. Revise here is/are and possessive adjectives. Revise the conjugation of 'aller' (to go). Learn how to form the perfect tense. Differentiate between the present and perfect tenses. Revise the simple future tense.
